Dear Local 890 Brothers and Sisters,

Welcome to the latest edition of our quarterly newsletter! As we dive into the second quarter of 2024, I am pleased to say we are extremely busy with a great work outlook. There are a few things I would like to get out to the membership to let you know what we have going on around the hall. As of writing this letter, we have over 60 people signed up for our in-house retirement seminar including representatives from EMPOWER, PIMCO, and WEEBF. I feel it is always easier to ask the questions you have in-person as opposed to watching a webinar. We have another Health Gauge event coming up May 22nd to promote preventative healthcare. Last year when we offered this at different locations statewide, they reported 2 members had to be rushed immediately to the hospital for different issues that may have saved their lives. Remember to sign up today to get your free health screening.

We are also excited to say the training center is coming along with more classes being added each semester. It is our plan to offer more diverse options and some shorter classes for those who are looking for a quick refresher and CEUs. We already have 7 members attending the annual National Training Institute this year and will bring back the tools and material to expand our class options.

As many of you have heard, we have a Local 890 Job Fair coming in June. We are looking to add membership and fill the demand for workers as we continue to grow our local and gain market share. We are excited to host this outreach to get to know other electricians in the area and share what we have to offer.

As healthcare costs continue to rise, the health and welfare trustee board has decided to increase the premium by 5% and \$.25 to the reserve. This increase is needed as the average monthly premium does not cover the average monthly outgoing cost per member. We have another raise coming in June of \$2.38. Wage allocation options will be presented at the May meeting and be voted on in June. It is my hope to start to chip away at our 150-hour requirement for health care premiums to a lower hour amount and in turn, raise our dollar banks. This will give members more opportunity for optional time off without worrying about coverage. This would also give us the ability to maintain full coverage for any of us that would like the option to retire early.

In closing, I would just like to thank you all again for the opportunity to represent this local and our membership in this position. I have learned so much since being elected, and I appreciate your trust in me to have the locals best interests at heart. In solidarity,

Organizer Report



Dear brothers and sisters,

It has been a busy start to the year for our organizing team. Local 890 has been very busy with work in the beginning of the 2024 year and will not be slowing down anytime soon. With more projects starting in the spring/summer, organizing efforts will be crucial to man these jobs. We will continue to make job site visits to non-union contractors and make house visits to non-union individuals. These efforts will continue to help the growth of our membership and keep up with the demand. I am proud to say that Local 890 has had a net growth of 7.1% in our membership over the past year. This surpasses the IO benchmark of 4%. We were in the top 3 in the 6th District for net growth over the past year. We look to continue this trend this coming year to stay on top in the 6th District.

Local 890 assisted our brothers and sisters from LU-430 in blitz and job fair in the beginning of March. As a group we knocked on a total of 326 doors and visited 8 non-union job sites. The job fair brought in a total of 109 applicants, with 79 individuals having zero electrical experience, and 30 having at least one year of experience.

Local 890 will be attending many events coming up in the near future, including 6 career fairs throughout our local. We will be hosting a two-day blitz, and job fair in June. We would appreciate member participation in this event. Be on the lookout for more information in the coming months. Thank you for all your support!
