## **Organizer Report**



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is hard to believe that the second quarter of 2024 is already in the rear-view mirror. We are now in the busiest part of the construction season. Work is busier than ever and doesn't seem to be slowing down. Even with the tremendous storms that had affected most of southern Wisconsin, work has continued to be steady throughout the 2024 season. With that being said I hope all my brothers and sisters overcame the storm's events and remained safe.

Organizing efforts have been very busy. Local 890 held a job fair in June and we had great interaction with applicants that attended the event. We had a total of 36 applicants attend and we have placed 7 with contractors. Prior to the job fair I hosted the LU-890 blitz where we knocked on a total of 716 doors to promote the job fair. These events would not have been possible without my fellow office staff, organizers from across the state, and the members. Thank you all that helped out, your dedication does not go unrecognized. I am proud to say that I have stripped three Jake's Electric apprentices and all three are working for Westphal now. With that being said, Jake's Electric and PDC will continue to be my top targets in upcoming organizing efforts.

I was busy with school fairs around the locals jurisdiction and attended a total of 10 high school job fairs. There have been many high school students that have reached out to me to get more information on the opportunities Local 890 can provide. I look forward to working with these students in the future. I have also assisted in job fairs and blitzes throughout other locals in Wisconsin as well. They include LU 159, LU 494, LU 430, and LU 158. Through these blitzes my fellow organizers and I have made 2,860 house visits so far this year. These efforts will continue strong throughout the 2024 year. IBEW nationwide has a total membership of 838,000. The 6<sup>th</sup> District has increased membership by 3,348 since July 2023. Local 890 has grown significantly in 2024. In February we had 671 members and are now at 741 members. This is a 10% growth rate which satisfies the 4% growth rate goal the international sets for every local in the nation. My goal is to reach a total of 800 members by the end of the 2024 year.

Thank you to all the members in supporting me in my new role as organizer.
